



Dr. Robinson has been having the walk relayed in front of his lots and residence. The job is pretty well done; but oh! What a mistake that it was not made five or six feet wide instead of four feet as it is. It is a walk where more travel passes during certain hours of the day than almost any other walk in town, and it is very annoying to be obliged to side track for a bevy of school children in stormy weather or drifting snow. It seems to have been an oversight by our board that an ordinance has not been passed requiring relaid walks to be not less than five feet width, and six feet would be much better, especially upon the street mention, First and Main Street. Bear it in mind gents at your next meeting.
